

NOTICE OF PROJECT PLANNING PUBLIC MEETING

The Village of Blissfield will hold a public meeting on the proposed Water Service Line Replacement project for the purpose of receiving comments from interested people.

The meeting will be held at **6:00 p.m. on Monday, May 4th, 2026** at the Village Hall at 130 South Lane Street, Blissfield, MI.

The purpose of the proposed project is to replace galvanized or lead water services at various locations throughout the Village of Blissfield to meet updated Lead & Copper Rule requirements.

Project construction will involve:

- Replacement of up to 490 lead and galvanized-previously-connected-to-lead (GPCL) water services including portions on private property up to the water meter

Impacts of the proposed project include:

Water services will be replaced at locations throughout the village that have been identified through records or physical verification indicating lead or GPCL material.

The estimated cost to users for the proposed project will be approximately \$3,900,000 to be financed over 20 years through the low-interest Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund (DWSRF) program. Based on 1,677 service connections, this equates to approximately \$12.32 per month per connection. Additional details are included in the draft project plan.

Copies of the draft plan detailing the proposed project will be available at the meeting and will also be available starting April 21, 2026 for inspection at the following location (s): 130 South Lane Street, Village Office.
